In the last year..

Over 1000 young refugees and practitioners received personalised information and guidance from our advice service.

2,865 hard copies of the educational welcome pack distributed in English, Dari, Pashto and Ukrainian to newly-arrived families

31 young refugees received regular, in depth casework support from our educational wellbeing team.

584 young people grew in their knowledge and confidence through our interactive education workshops.



Who we are

Refugee Education UK (REUK) started out around a kitchen table in Harlesden. A small group of volunteers from a local church. A small group of young refugees from across London with no funding, no office, but lots of ideas.

Our team were all volunteers, and our founder, a former teacher, was still working her day job in education in emergencies policy and practice. We started small, and thought that was how we would stay. But word began to spread, and children and young people who knew about our work through friends began to ask for support through social media. Schools, colleges, universities and local authorities began to reach out for advice and services. And so we grew – and started to build the education support programmes we now offer to hundreds of young refugees across the country.

We have grown from a small volunteer-led local project into a national organisation supporting refugee and asylum-seeking children and young people across the UK. We want all refugee children and young people to be able to access the level of education that's right for them – from primary school through to university.

A refugee is a person who has been granted refuge in a country other than their home country.

An asylum seeker is a person who seeks asylum – protection – in a country other than their own.





**Why support
REUK?**

When children and families are forced to flee their homes, they miss out on their education as they make dangerous journeys trying to find a place of safety. We work with young refugees and asylum seekers who have been forcibly displaced from their home countries and want to create a bright and hopeful future through continuing with their education in the UK.

By fundraising or making a donation, you can bring hope, direction and the opportunity to learn to the 3,500 unaccompanied minors in the UK.

At REUK, we enable young refugees and asylum seekers to plan and navigate viable pathways through further (FE) and higher (HE) education, enabling them to thrive with their education and access additional support as they progress at all stages of their journey.

For each one of these young people, REUK offers advice and guidance in overcoming the multiple barriers to accessing education; supports their achievement of significant and often life-changing educational outcomes; and helps them use their education to create meaningful futures in leadership and employment.

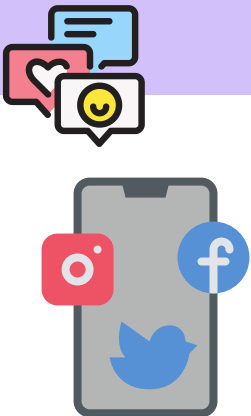
Go cold turkey

Tips for success



Set a target

→ Campaigns with targets do better than those without



Tell a story

→ Make sure your audience knows why you're fundraising for us!
Telling an emotive story will connect the audience to the cause.



Make it easy to donate

→ Make the process of donating simple and clear, it should be easy to donate!



Share it on social media

→ Add hashtags, and tag family and friends

Tell them about REUK

→ We have done lots of incredible work with young refugees and asylum seekers. Show them where funds will be helping!

Adjust your goal as needed

→ If progress is slower than expected, adjust your target accordingly.



Update your fundraisers regularly

→ let those who have already donated know that you are getting close to your end goal, encourage a final push!
